Guidelines for Student Conduct are set forth in the California Education Code, California Administrative Code, Title V, policies of Administration and all civil and criminal codes. Students enrolling in California Career School educational programs assume an obligation to obey state law and California Career School rules and regulations governing the conduct of students.

Violators of these policy's may be subject to disciplinary action, which may include referral to an appropriate rehabilitation program, suspension, demotion, expulsion or dismissal; individuals may also be subject to criminal sanctions including fines, jail or prison sentences. The Program Director will handle student disciplinary action, the Director of Human Resources will be responsible for employee disciplinary action, and the Campus Security Team will work with local law enforcement agencies for criminal prosecution.

I. Guidelines for Student Conduct

In compliance with the California Education Code (Sections 48922, 66017, 66300, 76020, 76021, 76030, 76043, 76120, 76130, 76131, and 87014) and in keeping with above, be it .

The Administration of California Career School recognizes the need for a clear standard of behavior on campus and the following violations of orderly conduct are cause for corrective action.

- A. Dishonesty, cheating, plagiarism, lying, or knowingly furnishing false information to the school.
- B. Forgery, alteration, or misuse of school documents, records, or identification.
- C. Knowingly accessing and without permission altering, damaging, deleting, destroying, copying, or otherwise using any data, which reside or exist internal or external to a computer, computer system, or computer network in the school.
- D. Obstruction or disruption of teaching, administration, or of other school activities on campus . This includes obstruction or disruption of administration, disciplinary procedures or authorized school activities. It also includes pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- E. Physical abuse or detention of any person on campus or other conduct which threatens or endangers the health or safety of another. This includes fighting on campus property or at a CCS sponsored event, on or off CCS premises.
- F. Theft of or damage to property of the school which includes property of a member of the campus community or a campus visitor.
- G. Unauthorized entry into or unauthorized use of campus property, supplies,

equipment, and/or facilities.

- H. Misrepresentation of oneself or of an organization to be an agent of the school.
- I. Sexual assault or physical abuse, including rape, forced sodomy, forced oral copulation, rape by a foreign object, sexual battery, or threat or assault, or any conduct that threatens the health and safety of the alleged victim.
- J. Use, possession, distribution, or being under the influence of alcoholic beverage on district property or at any District sponsored event.
- K. Use, possession, distribution, or being under the influence of narcotics, other hallucinogenic drugs or substances, or any poison classified as such by Schedule "D" in Section 4160 of the Business and Professions Code on campus property or at any campus-sponsored event except as expressly permitted by law.
- L. Expression which is libelous, slanderous, obscene or which incites students so as to create a clear and present danger of commission of unlawful acts on school premises, or violation of school regulations, or the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the school.
- M. Engaging in lewd, indecent, or obscene behavior on campus property or at any campus sponsored function.
- N. Possession or use while on the school premises, or a school-sponsored function, of any firearms, explosive, dangerous chemical or deadly weapon.
- O. Any act constituting good cause for suspension or expulsion.
- P. Violation of school policies or regulations.
